## **Role Summary**

This is an exciting opportunity to support the development of Arts and Health Research being conducted at the Research Centre within the College of Health and Social Care at the University of Derby. You will be working in the newly founded **Arts in Health Centre of Excellence** in the College.

You will undertake a range of research activities, especially working with existing research clusters in building bids for research funding. Other duties may include data analysis as well as writing for publication. The post-doctoral researcher will produce publications singularly and with cluster members. You will hold a PhD qualification (or be close to completion) and have a proven ability to contribute to the design and delivery of arts in health research. You will be required to demonstrate the capacity to produce work of 3\* quality, with aspirations towards world-class research.

You will be working with our Professor of Arts in Health, Susan Hogan.

#### **Principal Accountabilities**

- 1. Contribute to the development of new knowledge and techniques in the research project(s).
- 2. Contribute to the writing up of research findings and dissemination through publications or seminar and conference presentations (either singularly or with research cluster members).
- 3. If necessary, support the supervision of undergraduate projects and postgraduate research students in conjunction with other staff, and provide training and limited teaching as appropriate
- 4. Assist with the preparation of proposals and applications to both external and/or internal bodies for funding.
- 5. Plan and manage own research activity and initiate research relevant to the discipline or research project(s).
- 6. Where opportunities exist within the research project(s), support the development and delivery of business engagement activities, developing entrepreneurial links with external organisations.
- 7. Contribute to the writing of collective bids for funding, and, where funders permit, write individual bids

for funding with appropriate support.

- 8. Undertake appropriate training and staff development.
- 9. Understand own development needs and formulate a personal development plan.
- 10. Observe and implement University policies and procedures.
