Role Summary

The post holder will be responsible for providing academic guidance and support for learners studying. Associate lecturers will be expected to be academically competent to teach and facilitate the learning of students at the appropriate level and create a supportive learning environment and promote and engage in a 'community of practice' within the learner group. The post holder will be expected to work closely with colleagues in Social and Community Studies to ensure a high quality learning experience for all learners.

Principal Accountabilities

- 1. To be the first point of contact and to facilitate the learning activities for an assigned number of students as set out in the Schedule of Work
- 2. To utilise appropriate teaching, learning and support techniques to create an academically challenging environment that supports learners in their development
- 3. To upload learning materials onto Virtual Learning Environment (VLE), as appropriate
- 4. To be responsible for giving formative and summative feedback as required within the module teaching and learning assessment strategy
- 5. To mark learners work in accordance with the module requirements and the University's assessment regulations
- 6. To take a pro-active approach to the support and guidance of students to enable them to successfully meet relevant milestones
- 7. To monitor and report on the progress of learners and, where, appropriate evaluate the need for additional support in consultation with the Academic Lead.

- 8. To contribute to The University's Quality Assurance and Quality Enhancement process by providing feedback on the module, its content and delivery mechanisms in order to contribute to the continuous development of the module
- 9. To participate in an induction programme and engage with staff development and other professional development opportunities as required
- 10. To keep abreast of latest developments in teaching, learning and online techniques
- 11. To adhere to University systems and procedures and ensure that you have a working knowledge of the University's academic regulations
- 12. To undertake any other reasonable duty commensurate with the level of responsibility of the post
